Safety Practices and Social Distancing

- 1. If you or someone in your family or party are sick or experiencing flu like symptoms please stay home.

- 3. Maintain a minimum of 6ft from campers that are not a part of your family or party.
- 4. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your elbow when coughing or sneezing.

- 7. Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.

Check-in

If you would like to do curbside check-in please call to pay your reservation in full prior to arrival. When you arrive at the campground please pull up to the Park Here While Registering spot to the left of the office. Someone will come to your window for curbside check-in or you can come into the office to your right to complete check-in. If someone is in line in front of you checking in, please stay behind them. **Please Do Not Block the Gate.**

Check-out

Check-out is 12 noon for rental units, 3pm for camp sites. Please put your gate card in the box on the front porch of the store before checking out. There is a \$10 charge to your credit card on file for any non-returned gate cards.

Face Mask/Covering required for entry.

Propane

Propane is available for filling, **anytime between 10am-12, 2pm-4**. The cost for the propane should be paid at the store. 20lb \$15, 30lb \$22.50

Activities/Events

What you can do

- Take a walk to the bridge and walk the nature trail that cuts off to the right of the road before you get to the closed bridge.
- Visit the ducks on the pond.
- Bike riding around the campground.
- o Fishing- You can fish at our catch and release pond without a fishing license. Please stay on the dock or gravel area while maintaining 6ft distance from others. Also, if others are waiting to fish please be mindful of time and limit your visit to 30 minutes. If you have your PA fishing license you can fish in the Slippery Rock Creek. Our property is directly down stream of the closed bridge on the west side of the bridge. Please see the map for marked area.
